REGISTER NOW TO KEEP YOUR SPOT AT ECRA


Although campus is closed for the remainder of the school year, ECRA will continue school with online education for your children!

REPORT CARDS

We will not be sending progress reports for the period ending April 21st due to our conversion from onsite to online education, however you can expect progress reports in May. Report cards for the first quarter were posted in ParentVUE in Synergy in March.

As recommended the Public Education Department, students' report cards will not utilize letter grades during the remainder of the school year. A Pass/Not Pass system will be established for K-8 and a Credit/No Credit system for high school will be utilized. - <u>Houston Zoo</u>: There are plenty of different animals you can check in on with this zoo's live cam, but we highly recommend watching the playful elephants.
- <u>San Diego Zoo</u>: With what may be the most live cam options, this zoo lets you switch between koalas, polar bears, and tigers in one sitting.
- <u>Monterey Bay Aquarium</u>: It can be Shark Week every week thanks to live online footage of Monterey Bay's Habitat exhibit.
- <u>National Aquarium</u>: Walk through tropical waters to the icy tundra in this floor-by-floor tour of the famous, Baltimore-based aquarium.
